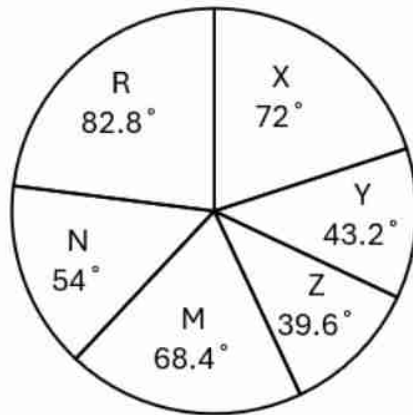

Even when procedures are out of date, institutions have a tendency to valorise and value prior achievements. Because of this, new ideas are often suppressed under the pretext of tradition, etiquette, or policy. There are many examples throughout history. The Church denounced Galileo's heliocentric theory, which is today a cornerstone of astronomy. In obstetric clinics, Semmelweis, a Hungarian doctor, found that handwashing with chlorinated lime solutions significantly decreased mortality. In spite of overwhelming evidence, the medical establishment was hesitant to acknowledge that physicians were the source of illnesses, but his methods served as the basis for contemporary antiseptic techniques. Alan Turing laid the foundation for artificial intelligence by speculating that machines could mimic human intelligence. His concepts were unpopular and far ahead of their time. However, Turing is now regarded as a father of computer science. Nowadays, before being proven right, whistleblowers who reveal systemic problems are frequently shunned. These instances highlight a persistent conflict between institutional orthodoxy and innovation. Therefore, true innovation demands a lot more than just imagination; it also calls for timing, resilience, and frequently a readiness to challenge the very structures one works within. The paradox is that although society demands change, it is equally afraid of what it will bring.
